10. Course overview:

This course is concerned in the study of origins and evolution of Local architecture to identify the main factors that influenced its formation. It aims to identify the components, characteristics, types, and its intellectual and philosophical orientations.

To identify the nature of the emergence of the first civilizations and Amaúrha and settled in Mesopotamia and trace the evolution of architecture in which even the Islamic conquests that have been affected by the study will focus on the vocabulary, Building Sommer confirmed Amorite first Babylon and Assyria, then as the Chaldean slalom on their territories, which affected neighboring Ohtathert where Alvrtheh such as architecture and greyhounds and Sasanian also shed light on the basis of Abbasid architecture that have been affected, including clarification of the students, which is that architecture Iraqi continuous and uninterrupted.

The course begins with definitions for this kind of architecture, and then studying the social and cultural factors that affect the form determination in Local architecture both as a space distribution and configuration and also the elements and components of the elevations (Formally & spatially).

11. Course objective:

Student will be presented to historical cities and traditional methods for buildings, architecture, & cities planning, in addition to knowing the old technology that used in that time, the student will have a wide view for all periods of civilizations happened in Mesopotamia and will know how to differ between each other.

Narrowing down the subject of Local architecture in order to make a path of knowledge with our vernacular architecture in Kurdistan region, and Sulaimani city specifically.

The student will recognize his built environment especially the traditional architecture, and understanding that the process of producing vernacular architecture is an on-going until today.

At the end of the course the student will be able to recognize the vernacular architecture; Also, the student will be familiar with the relationship between the concept of culture and Local architecture as a cultural form, and how to make benefit from the vernacular solutions in the contemporary design in order to produce an architecture that is socio-culturally orientated and accepted by society.

Based on this scenario this curse offering the student a knowledge base for dealing with conservation of historic towns and urban areas in order to protect and save his built vernacular heritage.

12. Student's obligation:

To get the best of the course, it is suggested that you attend classes as much as possible, read the required lectures, teacher's notes regularly as all of them are foundations for the course.
