	 4. Students will be able to explore, discuss, write about a similar topic or theme in two distinct disciplines (i.e. the hero in literature and the hero in history). 5. Students will be able to read and explore for enrichment works from various genre (novels, plays, poems, essays). Students will be able to effectively access resources in the library/media Centre to complete at least one of the above objectives.
