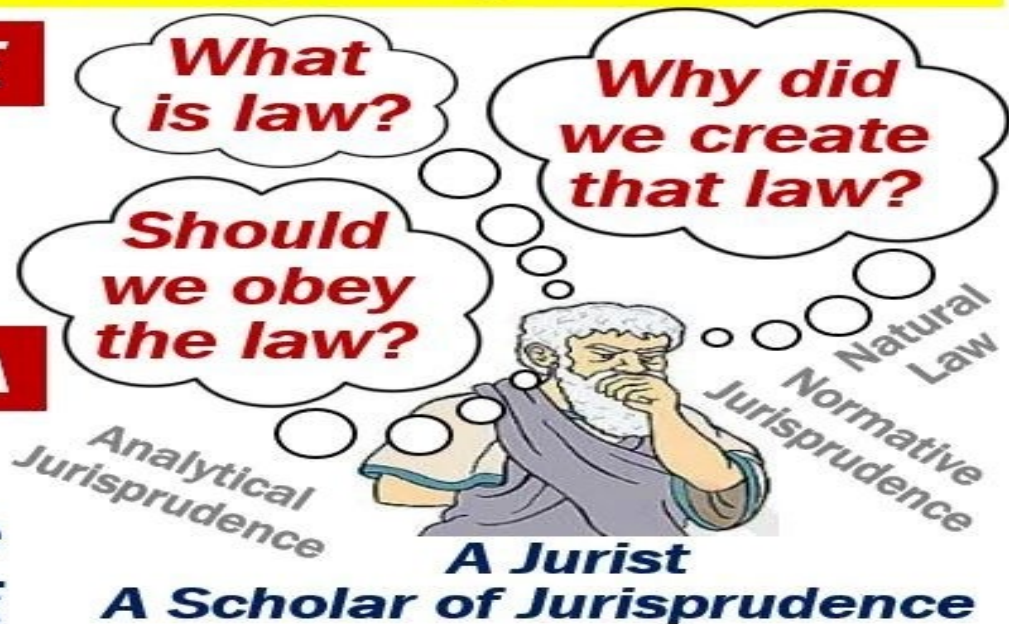

\* The supreme Court has exclusive jurisdiction over cases involving constitutional issues and federal.

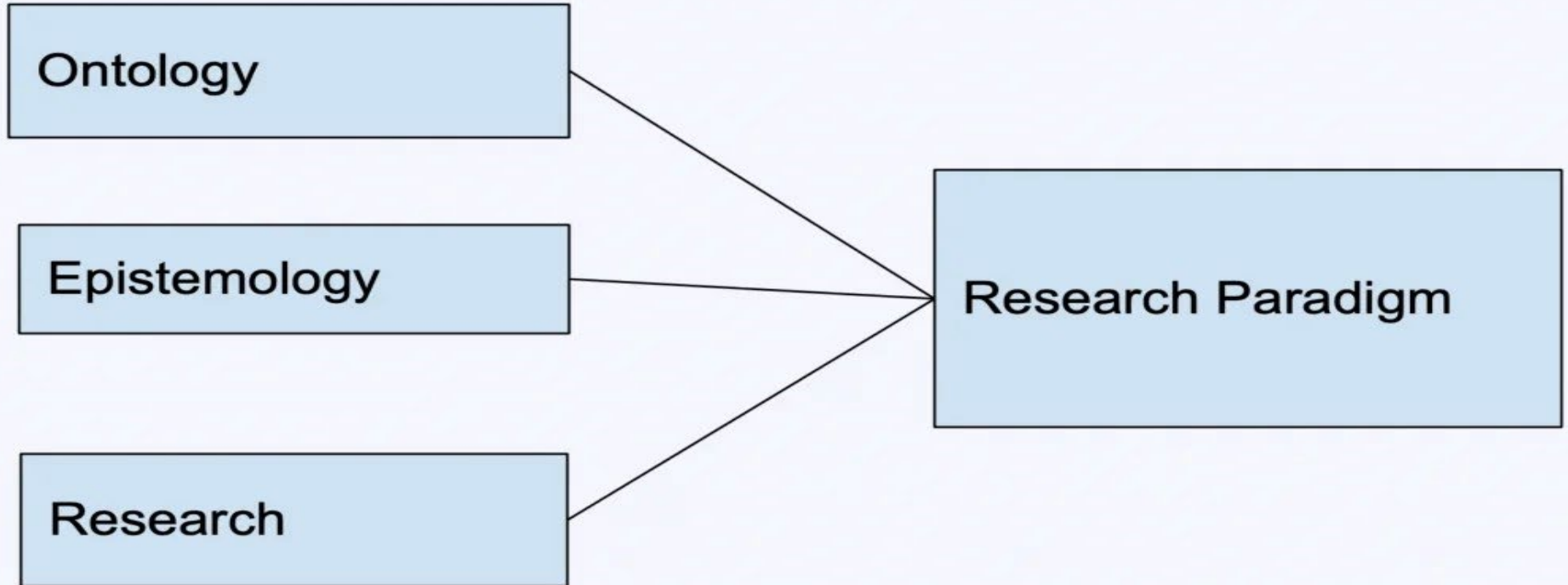
\* The local police department has jurisdiction over criminal activities that occur within the city limits.

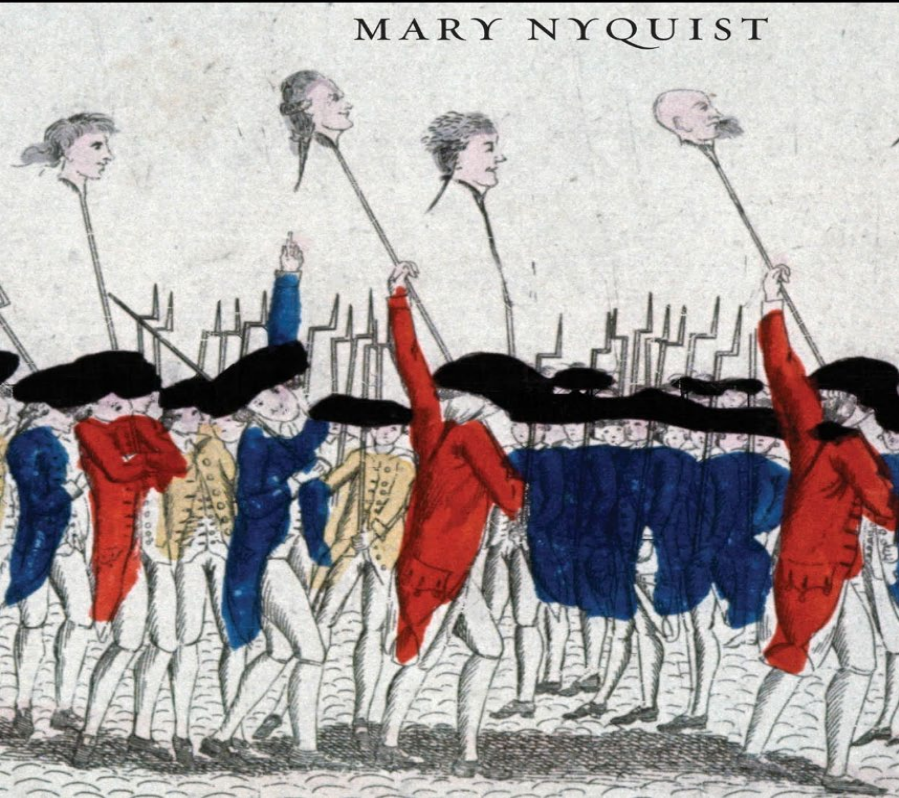

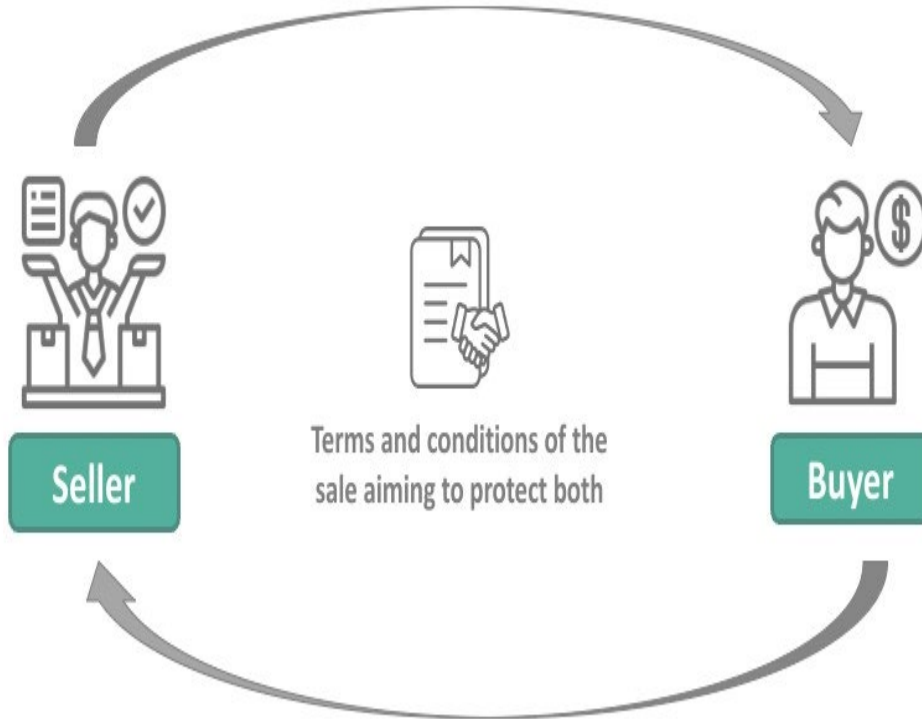
