



Natural Person

Natural persons **can own property** individually or with others. They can **enter contracts, pay taxes, and engage in political activity**. Natural persons might have restraints on their legal capacity.

Legal Person

When a government recognizes a legal entity, it confers rights and responsibilities. Entities can: **can own property, enter contracts, and pay taxes**.

Legal entities may or may not have the right to engage in political activity in their own name. Rights and responsibilities vary by jurisdiction.


